

NEWS FROM THE TRUSTEES AND FINANCE

Hurricane Damage Repair

We are writing this on December 18, 2024.

Our more observant and astute members have been reading the bulletin inserts and know that First Church is almost \$20,000 behind our budget going into December.

Finances were difficult everywhere in 2024. The economy was one of the top concerns for the 2024 elections. We all know what the struggle is, and we all know how our individual finances were impacted. The church is no different.



With that in mind we offer this report.

In addressing the property damage the church sustained during the hurricane, the amount of our deductible, meant our insurance was really of no help. (We Thank God the damage was that minimal.) To the best of our ability, the repair and cleanup expenses were kept at a minimum, but even so, they put stress on an already ailing budget.

The debris cleanup from damaged trees (etc) was \$7,050. This was a really special price.

The playground fence repair bill is \$1500. This does not include replacing playground equipment that was destroyed. (We will address that sometime in the future.)

With the wind-splattered debris from the storm adding to the mold and mildew we contracted to have the buildings soft-washed with pressure cleaning. That cost \$5,175. [BTW—this really made the property look great!]

These bills total \$13,725, which is in addition to the \$20,000 we are needing to meet our budget.

All money needed to pay these bills, will come from our meager church reserves—unless individuals would care to donate specifically to underwrite some of these costs, sparing us from having to use reserves.

To date we have received two (2) contributions, that help with roughly 1/3 of the hurricane expenses. If anyone would care to add an extra donation to these two, please mark it "hurricane."

We greatly appreciate the support and commitment of all our members.

If you're looking for a cause that helps children, then this is the one for you. Sleep in Heavenly Peace is a ministry that gives children a safe and comfortable place to lay their heads at night and is for children living in our community.

The beds are delivered complete with a mattress and bedding. If you would like to donate new twin sheets (twin only not twin XL), twin comforters or thick quilts and shams (matching sets would be great) please drop them off in the narthex on Sundays or drop by the office during the week. The office is open Monday-Thursday 10 a.m - 3:00 p.m.

Monetary donations are also greatly appreciated. Please make your checks out to Sleep in Heavenly Peace and add FL-Lake City to the check notes to make it specific for our Lake City Chapter. Checks can be dropped off at our church office or donated on-line at shpbed.org.

The past few months have been busy. We continue to deliver beds and we have been able to hold two sponsored builds!!! On October 26th we built 20 beds thanks to a sponsorship from the Law Office of Chris Costello. Chris was able to bring several members of his office and clients to help us. It was a successful day and our first sponsored bed build. Several weeks later, on November 16th we held Bed Build #14 with Lake City Lowes. We were able to build another 20 beds and we were joined by several of the Lake City Lowes team members!! This brings our beds built in 2024 to 157!!

We continue to get donations, and we were blessed with \$2,500 from the Buck Rogers Foundation. Additional Quilts came in from Lady of the Lake Quilt Guild and other Bed Linen donations!! Thank you!!

We had several memorable deliveries too. We delivered 3 beds to a family who had lost their home from Hurricane Helene. Rick & Ann Fortney and Dave & Kathy Smith delivered the beds and got help from the kids and hugs all around after.

Another delivery, the day before Thanksgiving was to a family with 4 kids who had fled a domestic violence situation. Mom had also recently lost her job. Thanks to the generosity of Steve & Elaine Stafford the family was also given a complete Thanksgiving Day dinner. Contacts were also made with the Christian Service Center and 1st Methodist Xmas Shoe Boxes for some early Christmas presents. Sandra Buck-Camp also donated.

In an upcoming edition of the Lake City Reporter Magazine, The Current, we have been told our SHP Chapter will be featured!!! Look out for it!!!! This is exciting news to get our name out there. Thank you!!

A MESSAGE FROM OUR RESIDING HOPE CHILDREN'S HOME

The following is a highlight of a girl named Lily at Residing Hope: Imagine what it's like for a child to be away from their family, at Christmas? A child who has been removed from an abusive home environment naturally feels very isolated. At this joyous time of year, these children truly miss being able to decorate their tree with family and friends and enjoy all that goes with the holiday season.

Lily is a young teenage girl who had to be removed from her home after experiencing neglect and abuse from her biological family. Her biggest challenge at that time was being able to move away from her self-destructive behavior. She was convinced that her situation was somehow her fault. Her therapist at R.H. created a therapeutic care plan including support of the teaching of her cottage parents and the Legacy Scholars Academy. They helped her understand that she was the victim in all this. With that support she developed positive coping skills. She has made considerable progress. Lily now takes great pride in her ability to care for herself. She is active in the student government at the Academy. She is even mentoring younger girls. Just like Lily, R.H. becomes the loving family these children and youth desperately need.

The children at the Home continue to depend on the generosity of people in general, but mostly churches. Our church is part of the overall support that gives HOPE to the more than 500 children currently in the care of R.H. That support is especially encouraging to the residents during the holiday season. Thank you for making our church one of the bigger givers for its size!! Next year the Special 5th Sunday giving dates are March 30, June 29, August 31 and November 30. On those dates there will be a video story about one of the residents or highlights of the happenings at the Home. Please give as you feel lead. Put R.H. staff and children on your prayer lists.

We are blessed to represent Residing Hope for our church! Thank you for being the givers you are.
